

Guidelines for Assembling a Set of Pictures

SUPPLIES NEEDED FOR A SET OF PICTURES

One set serves up to 25 participants.

1. A minimum of 30 pictures (photos)
 - Choose photos with clear images. Avoid abstract or “art” photos.
 - Include a wide range of:
 - i. subject matter (portraits, action shots, landscape, still life, animals, people of different ages and ethnic backgrounds, etc.),
 - ii. mood (humor, compassion, confusion, disgust, fear, delight, curiosity, etc.),
 - iii. photographer-source
 - It is not necessary for pictures to be “pretty” or well-composed. The selection may consist of both colored and black-and-white pictures.
 - Choose pictures that are large enough to be viewed by everyone in a small group but small enough to conveniently store and carry.
 - Consider using post-cards. Otherwise, laminate or mount your pictures on cardboard.
2. Two or three large pictures visible from the back of the room. (You will be using these to demonstrate the activities).
3. Scissors and paper-cutter as well as either:
 - laminating supplies or
 - cardboard and glue for mounting

DESCRIPTION OF COMPLETED SET OF PICTURES

A set of two large photos (laminated or mounted on cardboard) and 30 smaller ones

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS TO ASSEMBLE A SET OF PICTURES

1. Select 30 small and 2 large photos.
2. Laminate or mount any picture that would not be able to withstand frequent handling.
