Anger — Stimulus or Cause? PRISON

Take turns reading the statements given below or make up your own statement when your turn comes up. Imagine that the speaker of the statement is angry. After you make the statement, challenge your group by asking, "Stimulus or Cause?"

Others in the group now slap down their card, choosing to show either:

- STIMULUS of anger (an NVC *observation* — what we see or hear without any evaluation), or
- CAUSE of anger (thinking that implies that someone — or something — *should* or *should not* have behaved a certain way, i.e. was wrong in some way or another.)

1. He was looking at me and said, "Fatso."
2. He is trying to put me down.
3. You blame other people for your own problems.
4. The officer spoke to me loudly - at a volume I am not used to hearing.
5. The officer was yelling at me like I was deaf or something.
6. My cell mate is stealing cigarettes from me and thinks he can get away with it.
7. My cigarettes are not at my house where I had left them.
8. Good mothers don't hit children.
9. Your last visit here was over a month ago.
10. You just spilled coffee on the floor.
11. I sent a kite three weeks ago and they ignored me.
12. You are being careless with your coffee.
13. You haven't bothered to visit me for over a month.
14. I saw her hit the child on the head more than five times.
